CCARA REPEATER OFF THE AIR

On August 19th the CCARA repeater (147.045) was hit by lightning. The receive antenna was destroyed and some of the controller and amplifier equipment was also damaged rendering the repeater useless.

The club has some dedicated hams on the repeater committee who have determined that we will need at least \$450 to get the repeater back on the air. The repeater has served the amateur community so well over the last twelve years or so, and we have not had to put much money into the equipment. Now, however, we have the necessity to replace some of the worn parts, and get the repeater back into A-1 condition. The club treasury is basically composed of membership dues from club members, and is not able to handle large expenses. The club officers would like to put before the local ham community the opportunity to donate to the project of restoring the club

repeater.

This is, of course, entirely voluntary. Any contributions would be gratefully accepted and put directly to the use of refurbishing the CCARA repeater in Coshocton County. If there might be any overflow, we would also consider helping to improve the equipment of the ARES repeater. The 145.23 repeater is privately owned, but it

has well served us as the ARES repeater, and, as now, been a great back-up facility for us in times of need.

ULS Hotline Support also is available via e-mail <ulshelp@fcc.gov>. Contact ULS Hotline Support if you have questions about which applications to use, what information is being requested on a ULS form or schedule or any other ULS-related licensing matter. The FCC continues to provide ULS technical support weekdays from 8 AM until 6 PM Eastern time. Call toll-free. 877-480-3701 or local. 202-414-1250 (TTY 202-414-1255). Technical Support handles questions concerning computer access to ULS, uploading files, submitting attachments to ULS filings and FRN passwords. The FCC notes that all calls to the ULS hotlines are recorded.--

All Exam elements available. The 2004 exam fee is \$12.00. Exact amount appreciated. Checks made out to ARRL/VEC accepted too. 2nd version of exam available at VE discretion, time permitting, for an additional \$12.00.

REQUIRED:

PHOTO ID (driver's license) or two forms of non-photo ID.

Persons without photo IDs, and/or young persons must supply TWO forms of alternate identification to satisfy their ID requirements.

These two items can include: Non-photo ID/driver's license; Social Security Card (as FCC presently requires each applicant to supply a taxpayer ID number also known as our Social Security Number); Birth certificate (must have the appropriate seal); Minor's work permit or school report card; Utility bill, bank statement or other business correspondence that specifically names the person; a postmarked envelope addressed to the person indicating the same mailing address as shown on Form 605; or an employment ID.

CURRENT ORIGINAL AMATEUR RADIO LICENSE and COPY (if you have one)

ORIGINAL valid CSCE(s)

that apply and COPY (if you have them)

Social Security number or FCC issued FRN (FCC Registration

Number) (The FRN is viewable by doing a search for LICENSE at the FCC WTB ULS web page

http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/. An FRN is a ten digit number preceded by three or four zeros then six or seven numbers.)
